# WEBELOS WOODS 2010

## Leaders/Parents Guide

### General Information

Webelos Woods is a light version of Boy Scout Summer Camp. From the moment they walk on the property the Webelos are treated like Boy Scouts. This is part of the transition from Webelos into Boy Scouts. They're expected to work together and take care of themselves. (Of course, we ask each pack to send a certain number of leaders to ensure the boys are safe). Scouts learn the skills inherent in the Activity Badge Programs and Scout Skills Evening Activities. In the Webelos Camp Program Scouts will learn to trust their abilities, gain confidence in themselves, learn to work together with other Scouts to achieve a goal, learn to make new friends, learn to feel more comfortable in new situations and to be better Scouts. The skills they learn and practice will smooth the trail to the rank of First Class once they join a troop.

**Date** July 15-18, 2010

**Location** Wallwood Boy Scout Reservation

### Camp Fees

Scouts: \$125 if you register and pay on or before June 25, 2010

\$145 if you register and pay after June 25, 2010

Adults: \$ 45 per Adult - Adult/Scout ratio needed: 2 Adults for every four youth

**Leadership:** Two-deep leadership is required for each patrol. In most cases, the Webelos Scout will be under the supervision of his parent or guardian. It is essential that each Webelos Scout be under the supervision of a parent approved adult (**Guide to Safe Scouting: <http://www.scouting.org/pubs/gss/toc.html>**). If a parent cannot attend, arrangements must be made for another youth's parent (not the Webelos leader) or another adult to be a substitute. Register as many leaders & parents as you want. There is no such thing as too many adults.

### Registration

Packs should submit their registration packets by the deadline date June 25, 2010. Each person then needs to complete an individual registration form (Scout or Adult). The individual registration form must be in by 6/25/2010 for T-shirt orders. Forms may be emailed, faxed, or mailed to the Scout Service Center.

### Camperships

Camperships are special funds made available to provide the Webelos Woods experience to those campers who may need partial financial assistance in order to attend. Contact the Council Service Center for further information. Camperships will be requested by application. The deadline to submit an application is May 27, 2010. We will not consider campership requests after that date. The campership form may be obtained from the Suwannee River Area Council Service Center.

### Cancellation, Transfer and Refund Policy

The Suwannee River Area Council is required to make decisions about camp months in advance of camp. These decisions include camp staff, food ordering, and program supplies. For this reason any pack reservation cancellation made after June 25, 2010 will not be granted a refund. Individual refunds will only be made in cases of: death within the immediate family, summer school, illness/injury, or family relocation. Written verification must be provided at the time the refund is requested. Please advise your scouts and their families of our refund policy. All refunds, regardless of reason, will be given less a \$30 fee. There will be no refunds for no-shows at camp.

### T-Shirts

Each registered Scout & Adult will receive a Webelos Woods T-shirt. T-shirts will be given out Thursday evening after supper.

### Patches

Each registered Scout and Adult will receive a Webelos Woods patch. The patches will be given to the Pack Leader following the final inspection and check out Sunday morning.

# Check In

Your pack should plan to arrive at camp between 2:00 and 4:00 pm on Thursday. **No one will be allowed into camp prior to 2:00 pm.** When you arrive at camp, all vehicles should park in the main parking lot. In the parking lot you will be greeted by your Camp Guide who will assist you with the check-in process.

**Check in Procedure:**      *be prepared to:*

From the parking lot you will be sent to Camp Headquarters to begin the check-in process.

You will then go to the Health Lodge to turn in all health forms and medication.  
Remember EVERYBODY MUST HAVE A CURRENT AND SIGNED MEDICAL FORM.

After visiting Camp Headquarters and the Health Lodge you will be permitted to drive into camp to unload all gear. No scouts may be transported.

Your Camp Guide will take a survey of your campsite to identify any damages present at your check-in. After the survey you may unload your vehicle.

At this time everyone not already wearing their swim attire will change into it.

The last stop is the pool, where you will be given a swim test and issued buddy tags. Please stay outside the gate until it is your turn to come in.

Once you have done all of this & set up your campsite, come to the trading post. Here you will be given an agenda and begin your achievements at Webelos Woods 2010.

## Parking

You may drive to your campsite to unload, but you must move your cars to the parking lot after unloading. Only Medical Vehicles are allowed in camp during camp session.

## Restrooms

There are restrooms in each campsite & in the Dining Hall. The Health Lodge is not for public use.

## Water

Packs should bring a water cooler so that scouts will have cool water to drink in each campsite at all times. Scouts should bring their own water bottles to carry around camp to keep from dehydration. Containers that close are recommended. Water will also be provided at each program area.

## First Aid

A Health and Safety Officer will be on duty during camp. If you are bringing ANY medications to camp please see the health officer during check-in.

## Safety

No food or candy is allowed in your tent or sleeping bag. It attracts animals, ants & other bugs. Since this is a wooded area with a waterfront, all campers should be on the lookout for snakes & poison ivy. Stay on the trails. Closed toed shoes are to be worn at ALL times, even to the pool & when going to take a shower. The buddy system is to be used by the boys at all times.

## Cooking & Fires in campsite areas

**NO Cooking in campsites, everyone is being fed in the dining hall. Fires will depend on weather conditions and weather or not there is a fire ban at the time.**

## Check-Out

A final campsite inspection must be completed by the WW Staff prior to checkout. Final checkout is to be completed at Camp Headquarters. Patches & Advancements will also be issued at that time.

# Campsites

Webelos are expected to sleep in tents they have pitched while at camp.

Outdoorsman #2: With your parent or guardian, take part in a Webelos den overnight camp-out or a family campout. Sleep in a tent that you have helped pitch.

## CAMPSITE INSPECTION by Pack

At some time on Saturday, each campsite will be formally inspected.

## Uniforms

Scout uniforms **are** to be brought to camp. This is for **scouts & adults**. Part of being a Scout is wearing the uniform properly and with pride. Class "A" or the field uniform should be worn for the lowering of the flag in the evening and the closing campfire ceremony. The class "B" or the Activity uniform should be worn for daytime classes, morning flag raising and other activities. The proper uniform is to be worn at all times with the exception of aquatics classes where the Scout will be in the water.

### EQUIPMENT:

- Sleeping bag & pillow
- Tent & ground cloth
- Uniform (to be worn at flag & campfire ceremonies)
- Jacket, Raingear/pouncho, Hat/visor
- Clothes: enough for Thurs - Sun
- Swim suit & towel
- Personal hygiene items
- Bug spray & sunscreen
- **Water bottle & personal CUP with a handle**
- Folding chair (for your campsite area)
- Flashlight
- Scout Sprit—required
- Webelos Handbook (optional)

**NO electronic devices of ANY kind: radios, iPods, CD players, handheld gaming devices, cell phones for the boys, (they will survive without it) etc.**

We don't have any down time. We keep the boys very busy learning skills and having fun. By the time your son gets home to you on Sunday he's going to be exhausted but very pleased with himself. With everything that's going on during the day, he really needs his sleep at night. Your son will survive fine without them for the weekend so please keep them at home. If they are found, they will be confiscated and returned to your son's leader at the end of camp.

## Campfire Saturday Night

The Saturday evening campfire will include Webelos skits/songs, and presentation of awards to Webelos Patrols, Packs, & Leaders. Skits/songs are encouraged; any patrol wishing to participate should notify registration no later than Saturday dinner. Recognition will be presented at the campfire for the top patrols in each of the skill events, the campsite inspection, and overall scoring.

# Program

The program will consist of three nights of camping and two and a half days of activities from Thursday through Sunday. Program starts upon check-in. Packs should camp together.

Webelos will be put into Patrols and exercise the patrol-method of camp as much as possible. The Patrol method is used in Boy Scouts & this is part of the transition from Webelos to Boy Scouts.

## Evening Activities:

### Arrow of Light requirements & Scout Skills

The highest award in Cub Scouting is the Webelos **Arrow of Light** award. It is the only Cub Scout badge that you can wear on your Boy Scout uniform. You will work on outdoor skills, physical fitness, and learn more about citizenship and working with others. Upon completion of Arrow of Light, you can bridge into a Boy Scout troop.

The Arrow of Light award is worn on the left pocket flap of the blue Cub Scout Uniform or below the left pocket of the tan Boy Scout uniform.

# PATROL INFORMATION

Boys will be put into patrols Friday evening & will go to their class sessions as patrols. The patrols will be judged on Patrol Flag and Yell, Leadership, Teamwork, Skill Demonstration and Scout Spirit.

1. Each patrol must work together to learn and accomplish the different skills and tasks.
2. Each patrol should elect or appoint one boy as Patrol Leader.
3. Each patrol should have a Patrol Flag and a Patrol Yell.
4. Each patrol should exhibit "Scout Spirit" by showing an interest in, and a willingness to learn and/or work at the particular task, badge, or activity.
5. Each patrol should exhibit "Teamwork", by working together under the direction of one boy leader (the Patrol Leader) or his alternate, the Assistant Patrol Leader, with each doing HIS task or part.
6. Each patrol should exhibit "Leadership", which, for purposes of this event is defined as the Patrol Leader or Assistant Patrol Leader taking charge, showing the patrol flag and patrol name when arriving at a new competitive event, leading the patrol in the patrol yell and directing and assigning tasks as needed. Note: Items 3, 4, 5, and 6 are part of the judging - don't let your patrol lose points by not being prepared in these areas!
7. Each patrol must participate in all evening skill activities.
8. Each patrol must follow the rotation schedule handed out at registration on Thursday night and may not go to an event during a time other than the scheduled time.
9. We are all volunteers in this together. Our goal is to provide the boys with exposure to the Boy Scout troops, to help them learn new skills at camp and most importantly, enjoy themselves.

**Patrols will go back into Pack formation after the Evening Activities.**

**It gets dark around 8:30 & we want the boys to be with the Pack leadership at this time.**

## GENERAL RULES

At all times, Obey the Law of the Pack.

Stay with your patrol during the events and with your pack at all other times. Use the buddy system. If it isn't yours, don't touch it.

Stay away from the staff areas

Stay away from the waterfront (unless it's your time for the fishing Belt Loop & Pin).

Don't go into the woods; we don't want someone lost or hurt.

Don't mess with **any** wildlife.

Stay out of the Women's restrooms unless you are female.

Keep your campsite clean at all times. Dispose of trash properly.

Observe lights out and silence in the camp.

If someone gets hurt, let an adult know and have him or her get our medical team over to take care of the injured person. Don't move them unless they are in danger staying where they are.

**No vehicles in the camping area.**

No sheath knives are allowed on Wallwood property. No firearms, BB guns, fireworks, or slingshots are permitted.

After all of the above, HAVE FUN IN SPITE OF ALL THE RULES!

The Boy Scouts of America prohibits the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances at encampments or activities on property owned and/or operated by the Boy Scouts of America, or at any activity involving participation of youth members.

Adult leaders should support the attitude that young adults are better off without tobacco and may not allow the use of tobacco products at any BSA activity involving youth participants.

All Scouting functions, meetings, and activities should be conducted on a smoke-free basis, with smoking areas located away from all participants.
