Ten Commandments Hike

The Ten Commandments Hike is an annual interfaith, cross-cultural event designed to introduce youth to a spectrum of religious philosophies that value and teach principles found in the ten commandments. Houses of worship visited may include Baptist, Episcopal, Jewish, Roman Catholic, Islamic, Methodist, and the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The goal is for youth to gain greater understanding of the religious perspectives of different faiths, identify commonalities, and increase appreciation and tolerance of differing religious beliefs. During the event, youth will hike from one house of worship to another in the downtown Tallahassee area. Several houses of worship will be involved, each hosting one or more of the ten commandments. During visit, a local religious leader or designated speaker will provide a 15-20 minute presentation introducing youth to their faith and place of worship, and discuss one or two of the ten commandment principles.
